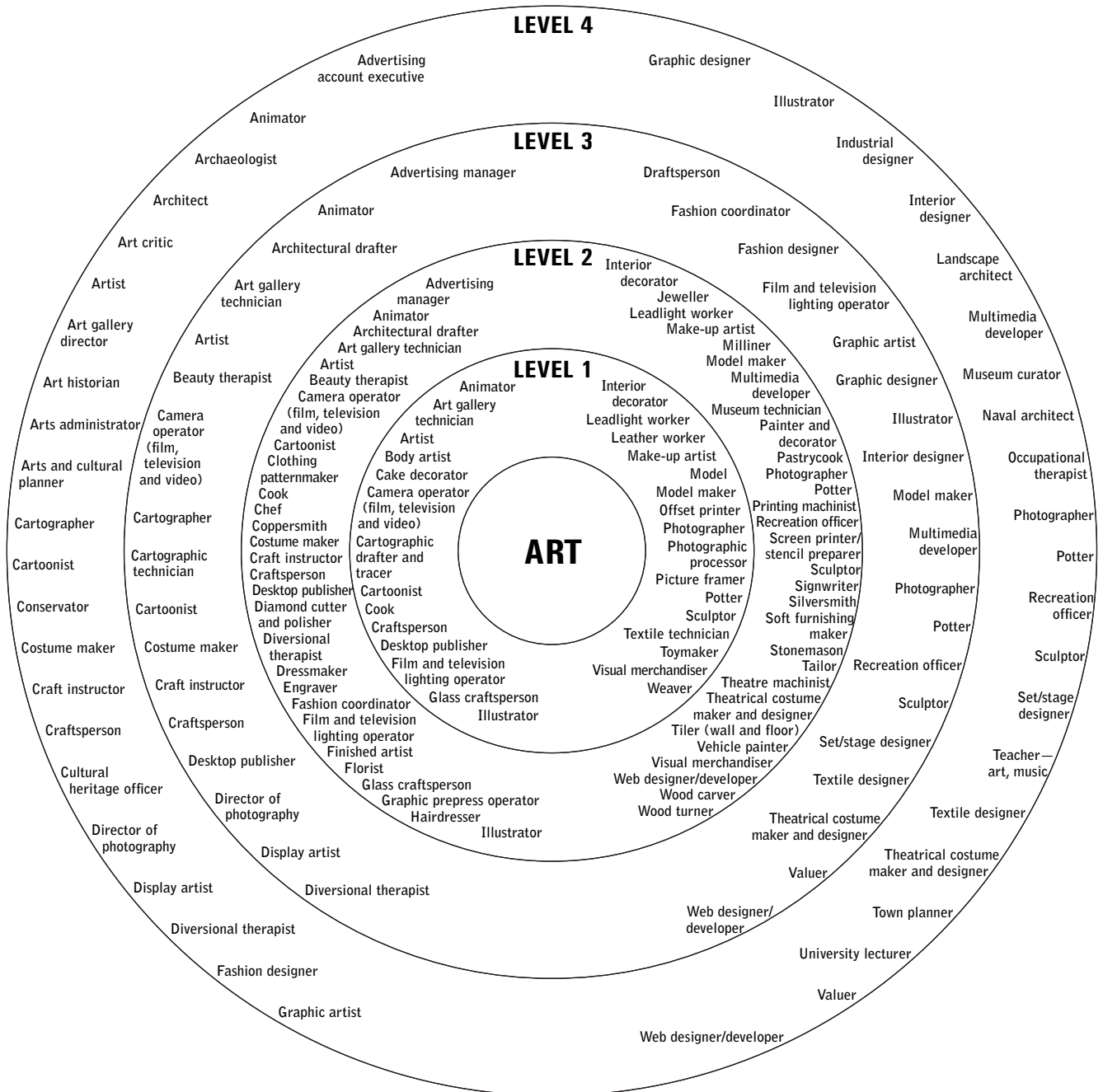
- * Discuss your ideas with your friends, parents, teachers and career adviser

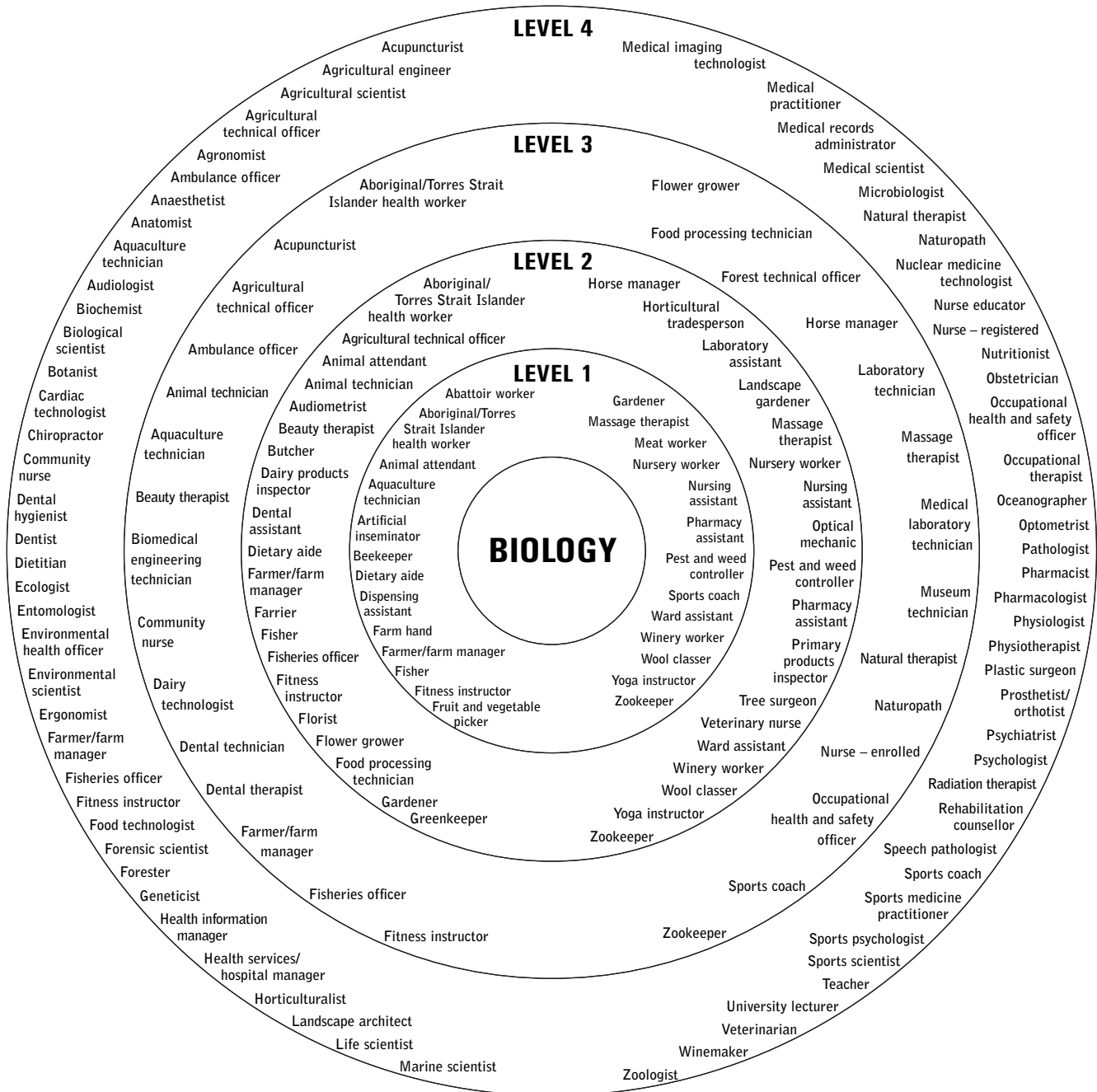

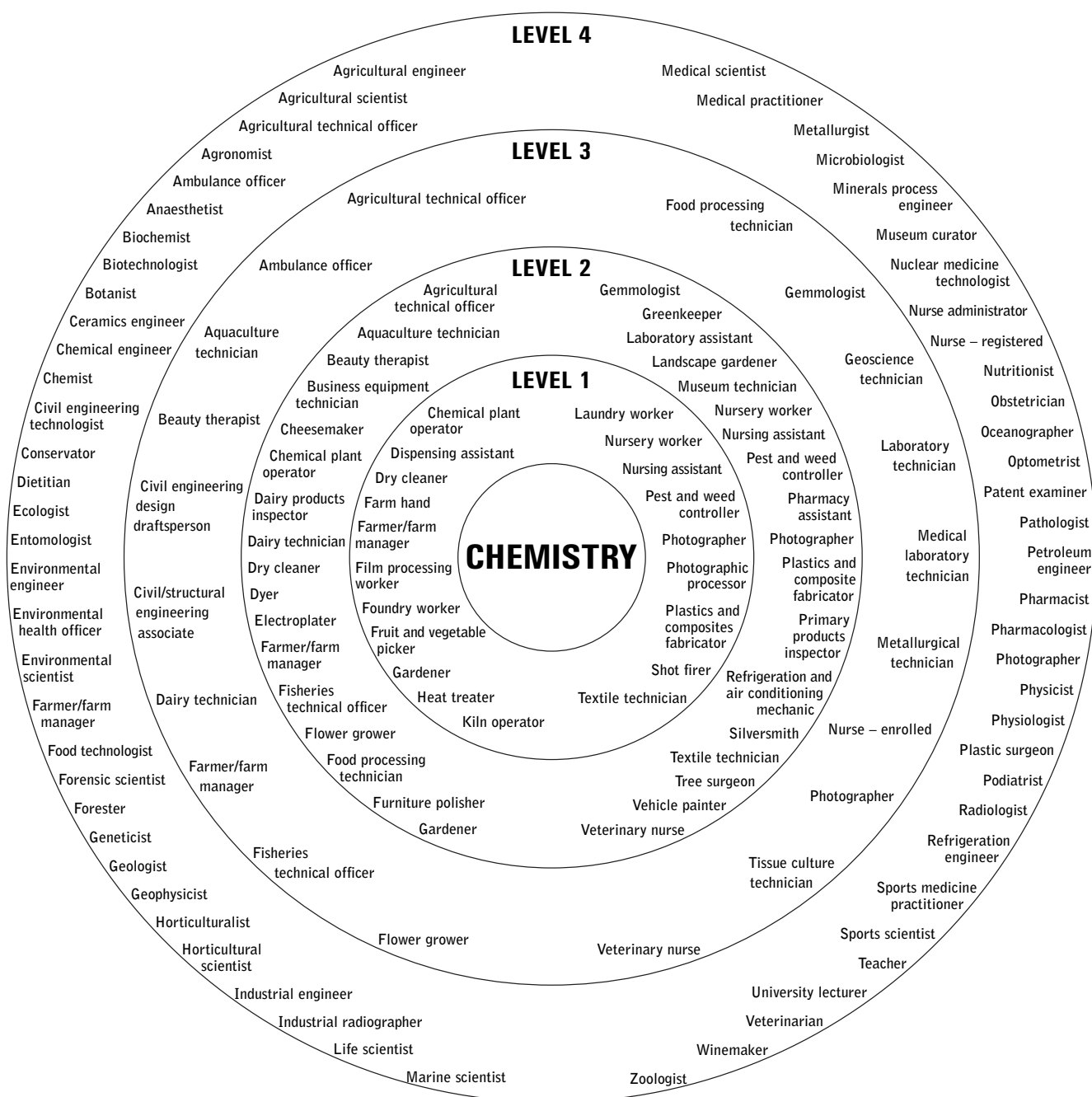

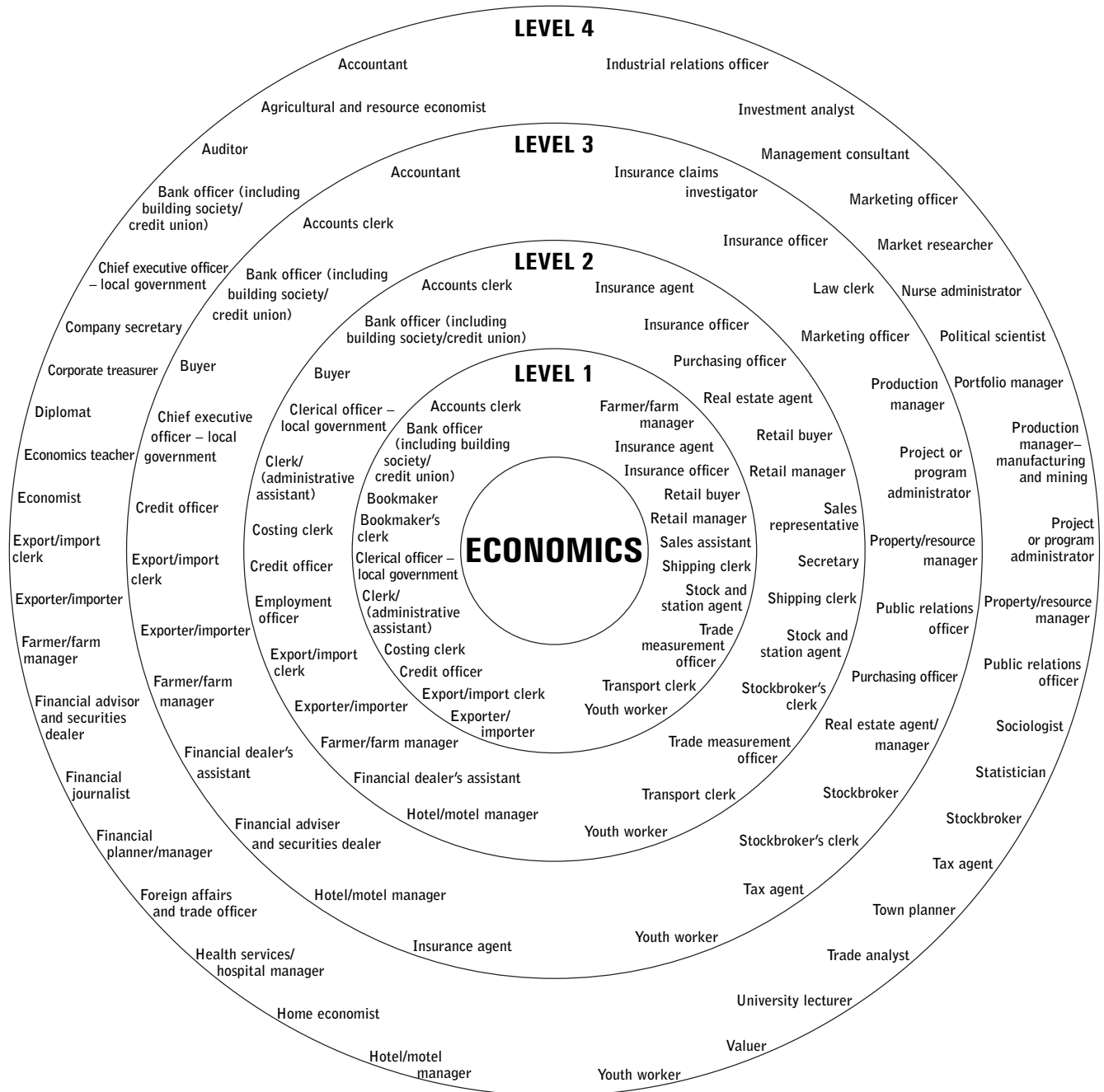

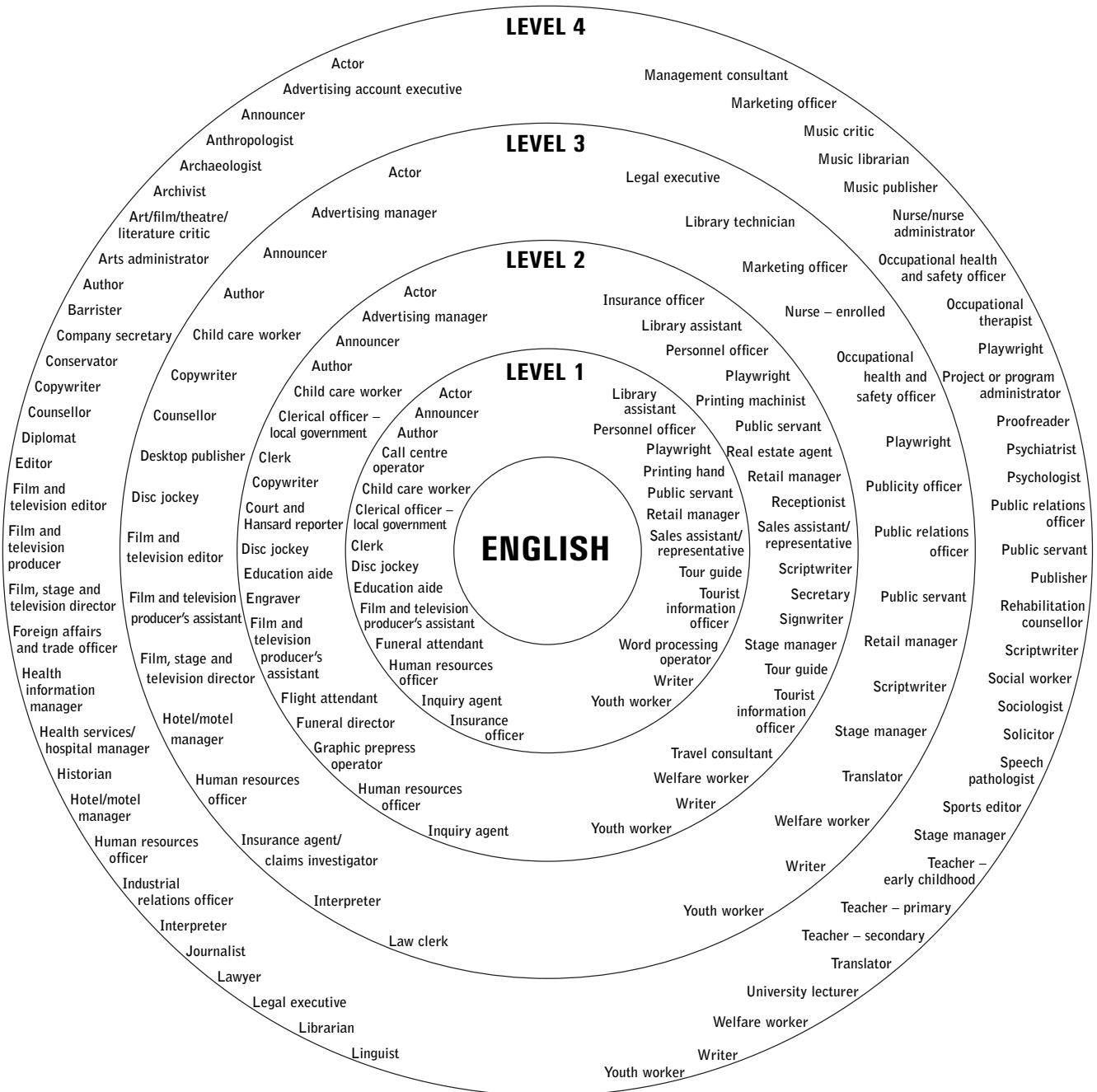

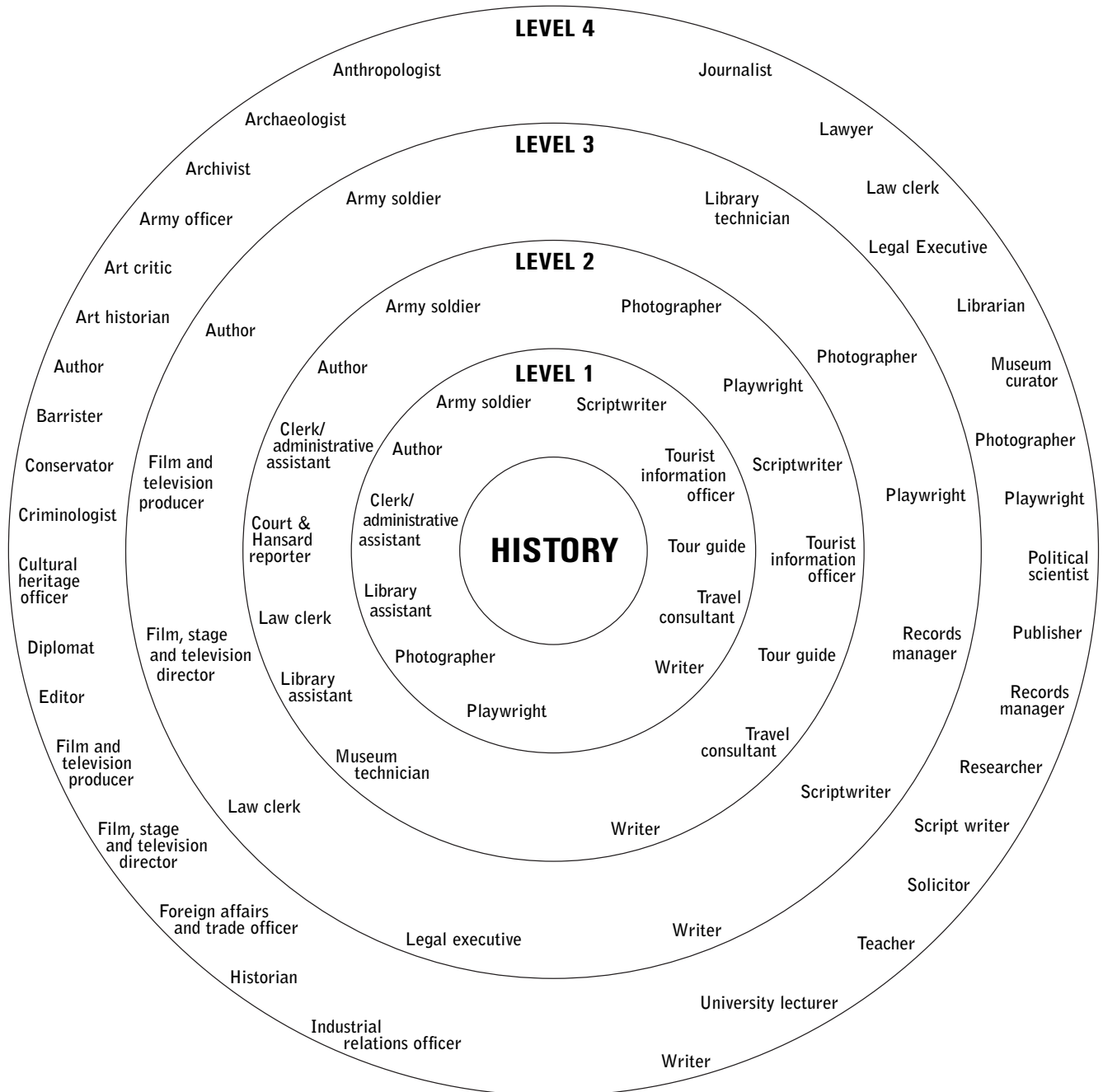

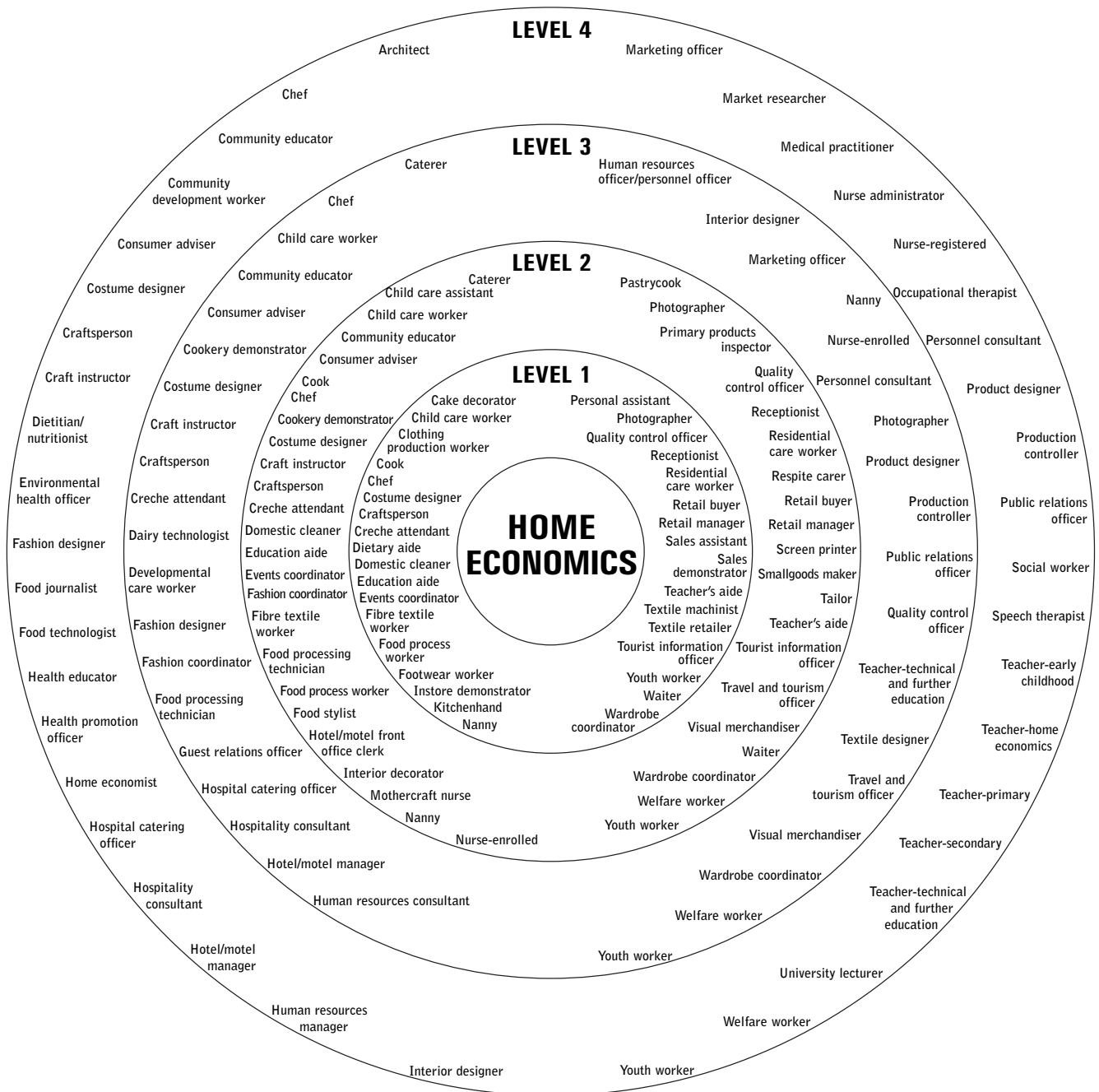

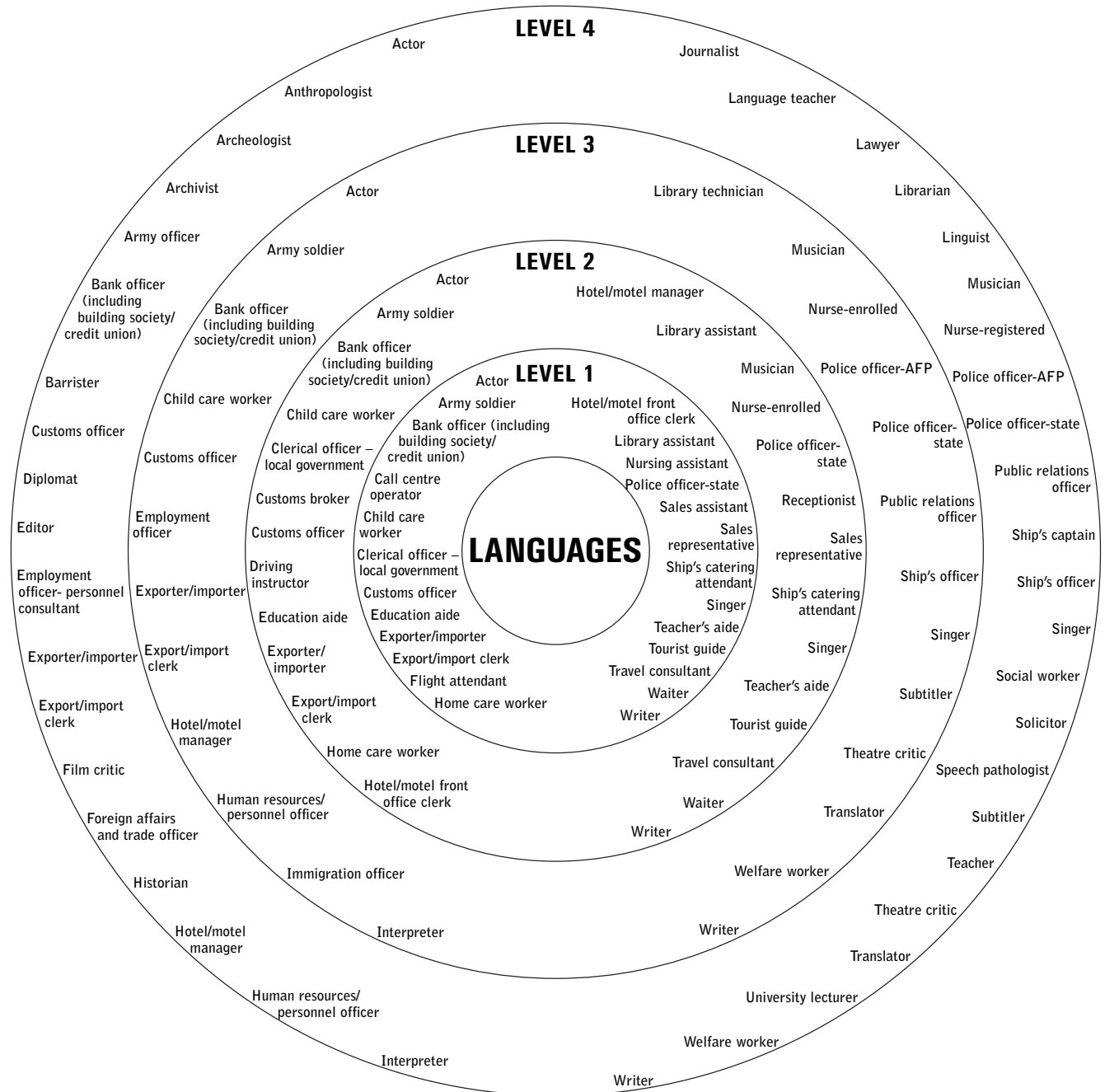

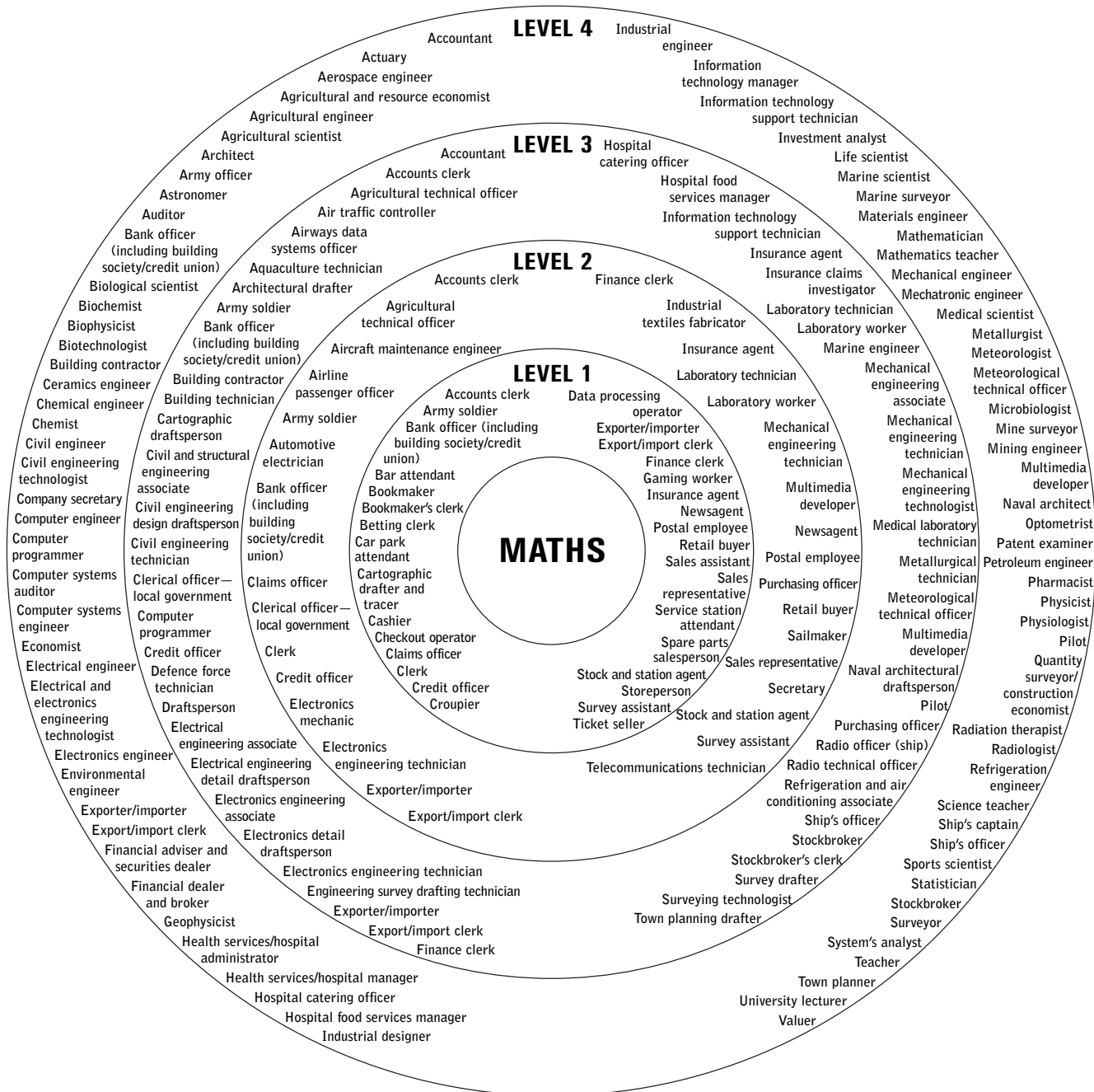

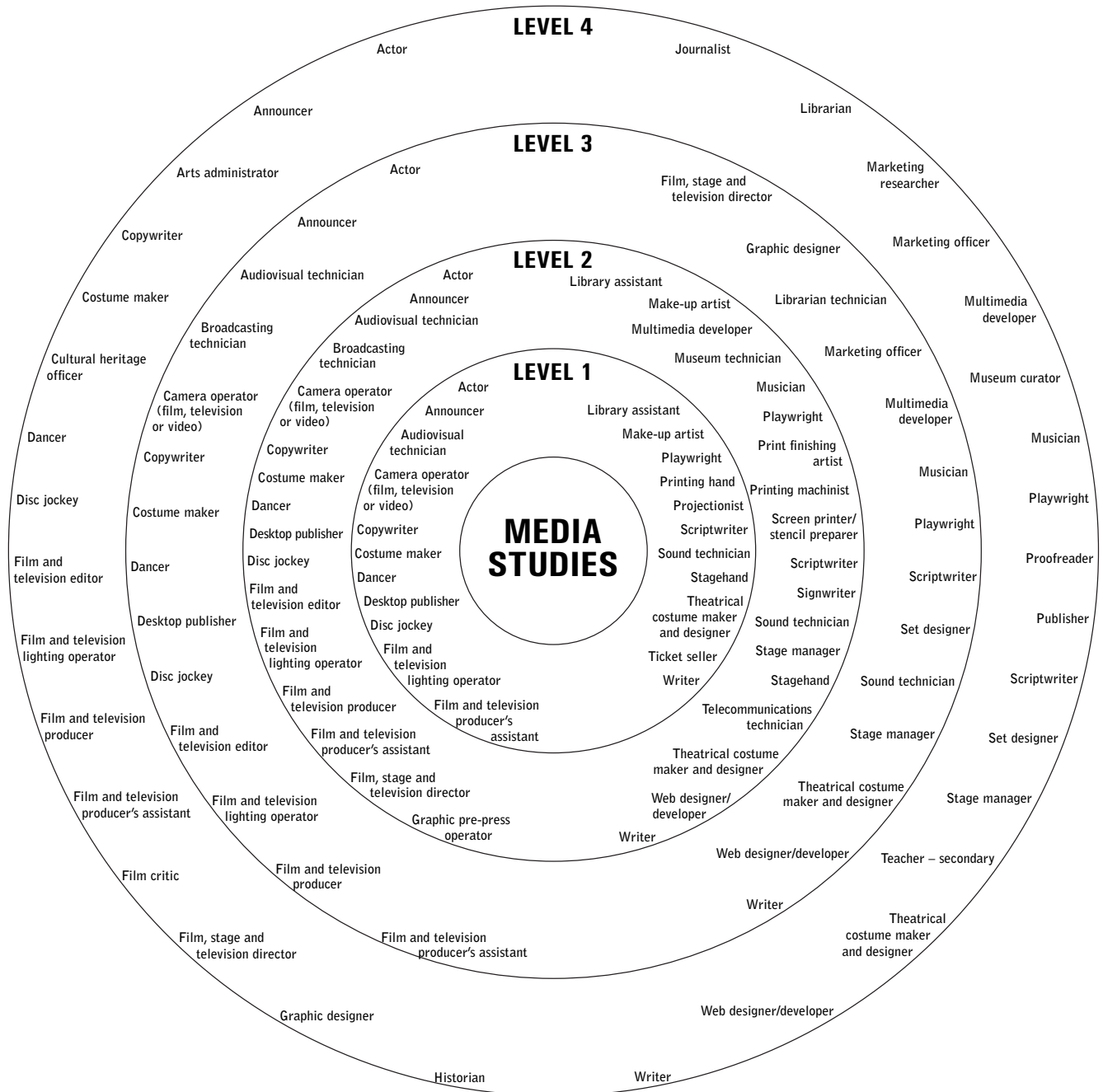

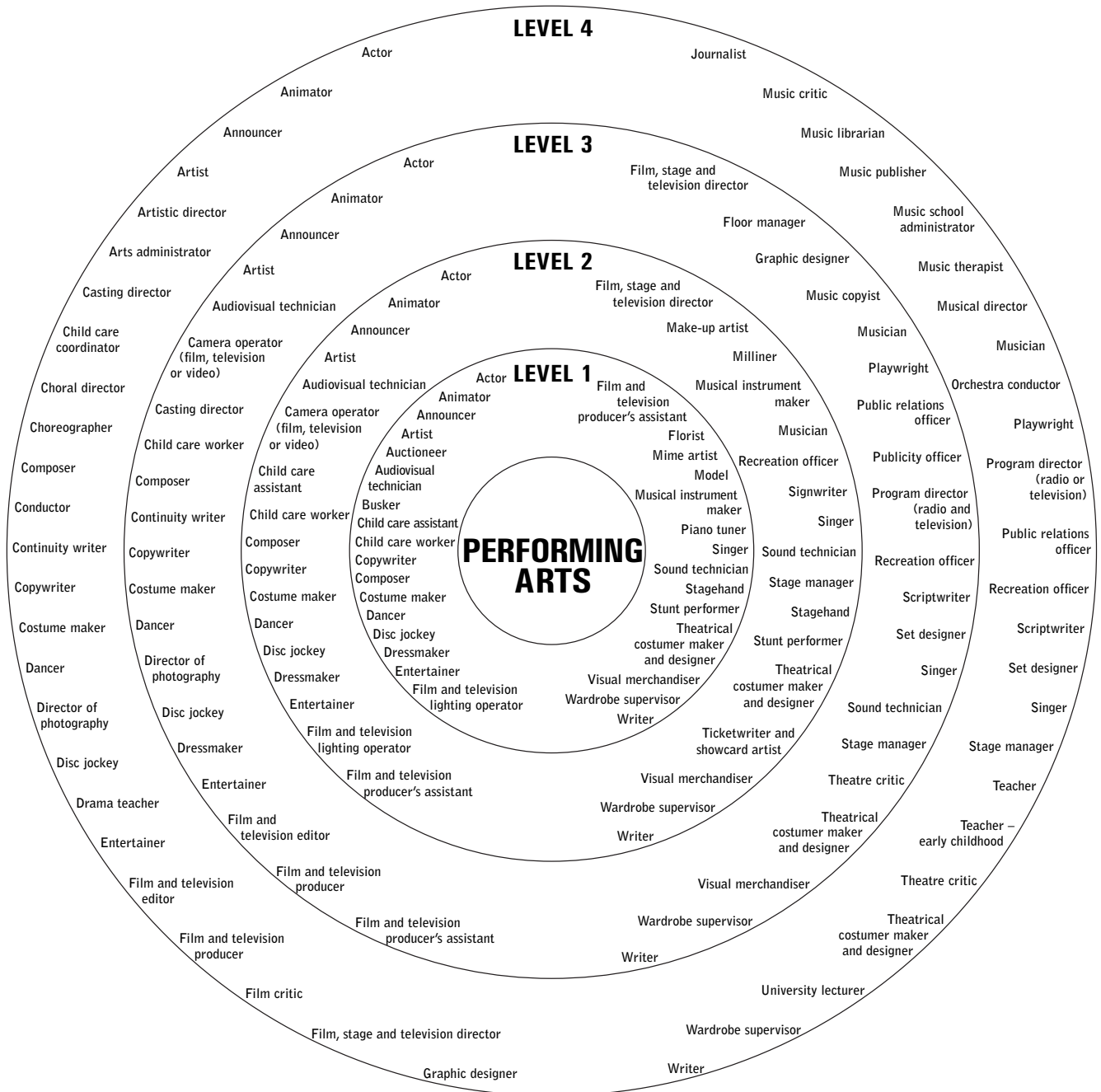

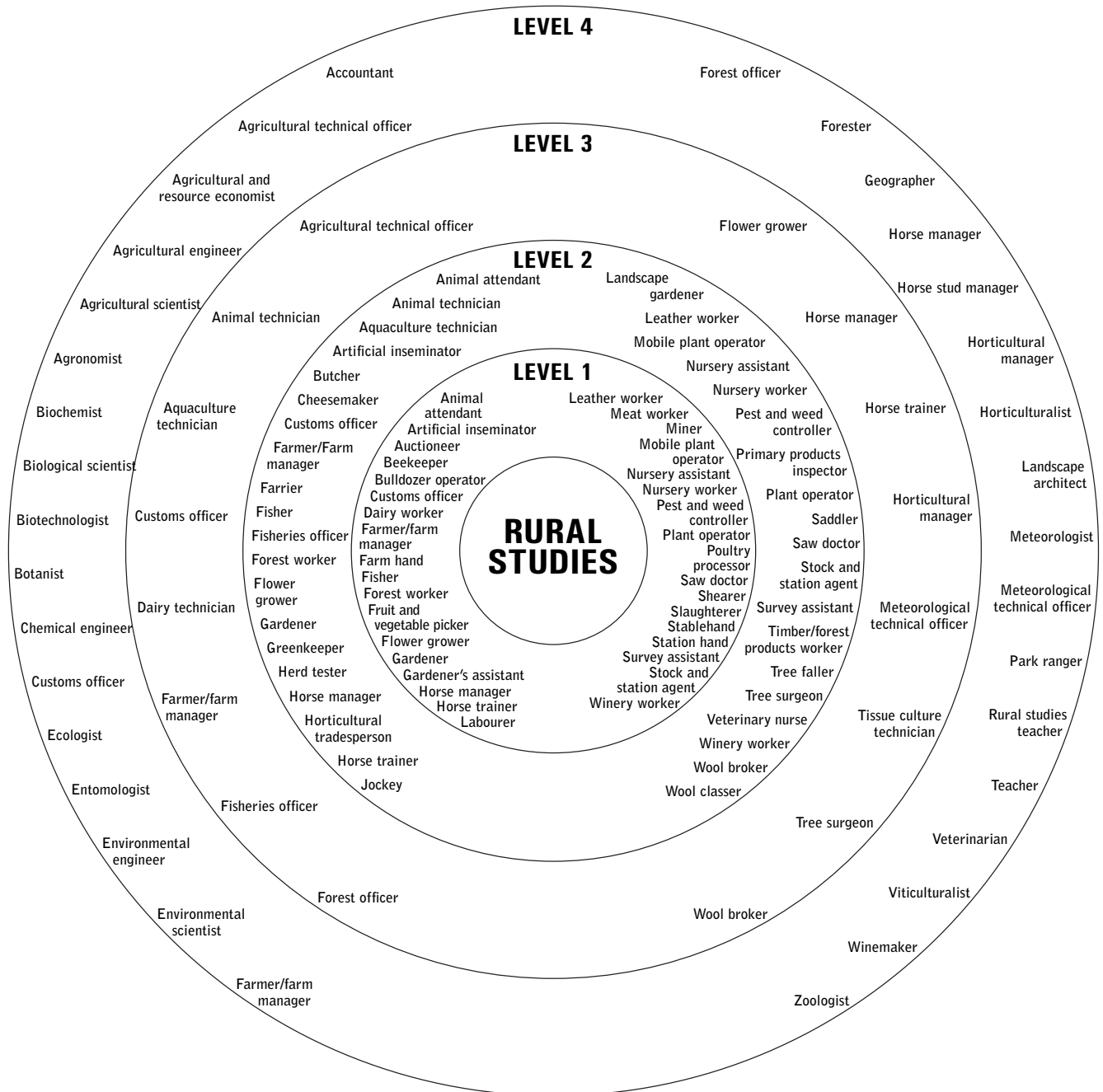
