

## **CIOS Fellowship – Final Report**

The following tables summarise manuscripts submitted, grants awarded and grant applications submitted during my CIOS Fellowship. The manuscript submissions have surpassed the targets that were initially set in my Fellowship application. I would be pleased to provide any additional information.

In summary, the fellowship allowed me to develop aspects of my research portfolio that would not have been possible with a teaching/admin load. In particular, the fellowship:

- Allowed me to develop a collaborative project of significant breadth with the Faculty of Health and the Vascular Network in HNEAHS. This built on the interprofessional research collaborative that I had initiated prior in 2008, but which had remained reasonably small-scale. The project will have a number of outcomes for our Faculty including a \$1.5 million NHMRC project grant application and a \$900,000 ARC Linkage project application. It has also allowed me to participate in a number of larger data collection exercises undertaken by HNEAHS which will lead to a series of joint publications. This project involves the HNEAHS executive, Innovation and Reform Unit, Vascular network (including stroke, cardiac, renal, diabetes services etc), and has required a great deal of time commitment.
- Allowed me to draft a series of publications (13 to date) and engage in preparation for additional publications for the coming year. In particular, I was able to engage in complex modelling which, for me, requires considerable time and focus which is difficult to achieve with a normal (research/teaching/admin) workload allocation. The ability to allocate additional time to data modelling and research review will have significant implications for my research output for some time to come and I anticipate submitting approximately 20 journal manuscripts for review as a direct consequence of the CIOS fellowship.
- Allowed me to collect data through a number of projects. Much of this data collection as planned prior to 2010, but would have been delayed or scaled-down without the opportunity to manage several diverse projects. Again, this will provide me with the opportunity to extend my research output for some time. All of this data collection was undertaken through CIOS research programs and will have an effect on the research outputs of the Centre over time.
