

Kelver Hartley Scholarships

The Kelver Hartley bequest promotes the study of French at the University of Newcastle. Notably, it offers a number of scholarships, designed to facilitate the study of French, both at Newcastle and in France, of students from all levels of study. Hartley French Undergraduate Scholarships

To be eligible to apply for this scholarship you must:

- be enrolled in the 1st year of any undergraduate program;
- be enrolled in French (FREN-) courses;
- be a Permanent Resident or an Australian Citizen.

Up to ten (15) scholarships will be offered annually. The scholarship provides a total of \$2500 to be paid in two payments of \$1000 after the semester 1 census date and \$1500 after the semester 2 census date. Selection of the scholar will be on the basis of academic merit, namely UAI or equivalent. The closing date for applying for this scholarship falls towards the beginning of semester 1.

Hartley Exchange Studies Scholarships

To be eligible to apply for this scholarship you must:

- At the time of application, you should be enrolled in FREN2610, FREN3610 or FREN3701;
- be accepted as an exchange student for a semester at the University of La Rochelle, France.

Up to five (5) scholarships will be offered annually. The scholarship provides up to \$10,000 to cover costs such as airfare to and from France, rail travel within France, visa, accommodation, a reasonable living allowance and health/travel insurance. Selection of the scholar will be on the basis of academic merit, including performance in French courses. The closing date for applying for this scholarship falls towards the beginning of semester 1.

Hartley Honours Scholarships

To be eligible to apply for this scholarship you must:

- be enrolled in a French (Honours) program;
- be enrolled full-time.

Up to five (5) scholarships will be offered annually. The scholarship provides \$4000 to be paid in two payments of \$2000 each after the census date each semester. An additional amount of up to \$1000 to support relocation to the University of Newcastle may be available upon written request to the Hartley Awards Committee. Selection of

the scholar will be on the basis of academic merit, including performance in French courses, along with a written statement outlining the applicant's honours research topic. The closing date for applying for this scholarship falls towards the beginning of semester 1.

Kelver Hartley Graduate Scholarships in French

To be eligible to apply for this scholarship you must:

- be a recent graduate within the last 5 years who completed a program majoring in French at the University of Newcastle;
- be a Permanent Resident or an Australian Citizen or a New Zealand Citizen.

The scholarship will allow a program of study in France for an initial period of up to 12 months. The scholarship may be renewed subject to satisfactory performance, up to a maximum of 3 years. Benefits include all travel costs from and to Australia and in France accommodation, living allowance and tuition fees up to a maximum of \$30,000 per annum. The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of academic merit and relevance of proposed program to their higher degree. The closing date for applying for this scholarship falls at the end of the calendar year.

Kelver Hartley Grants in Aid

To be eligible to apply for this scholarship you must:

- be enrolled in either a masters or doctoral research program in French;
- be a Permanent Resident or an Australian Citizen or a New Zealand Citizen.

The grant will include return airfares to the chosen French speaking country and assistance towards living expenses including meeting the cost of accommodation of a reasonable standard. Selection of the scholar will be on the basis of academic merit and relevance of proposed program to the higher degree. Successful applicants would normally be expected to stay for approximately 3 months; however, a period of 6 months will be considered. Successful applicants will also be required to maintain their enrolment at the University of Newcastle throughout their higher degree. The closing date for applying for this scholarship falls at the end of the calendar year.
